- The Basket Bingo that was held on February 10th had a \$5,274.44 profit
- The Texas Roadhouse received a \$66 profit
- Worship committee met on March 14th and discussed Holy Week
- Looking into the possibility of having signs throughout the borough advertising our church.
- Lower level emergencies light have been replaced.
- There will be a Bob's Evan's Fundraiser May 21-25 that will support the Back Bay Mission.
- Worship Committee will meet on April 23rd at Bob Evan's

- Pastoral Search Committee received its 4th profile. They will be looking a little further into it prior to potentially interviewing the candidate.
- We have received 3 roof proposals. Consistory members will reanalysis each one prior to voting.
- The new Floor Scrubber was purchase for \$1,850.13 and was paid upfront by the Early Learning Center. It was proposed that the ELC cover 70% and the church cover 30%. Steve made a motion and Kathyrn seconded the motion. All those that voted, voted in favor.

February 2018 Budget Update (Combined General and Building Funds)

The chart below shows a simplified over view of our budget numbers for the first two months of 2017.


The numbers through the end of February showed a combined surplus in the General and Building Funds of \$1,590 between budgeted expenses and actual offerings. The surplus was in large part due to the successful bingo we held in February. Thanks again to everyone who contributed toward the bingo to help make it such a success.

Our Early Learning Center also paid across shared expense amounts for February / March / and April during February so that resources were available to pay higher utility and snow removal costs than we experienced last year.

In the month of February we did not need to take anything from our building savings account to meet expenses.

On March 18th we had our most recent planning meeting for our trip in September. We have numerous fundraisers coming up in the next few months to help cover the cost of the trip so please mark your calenders:

Currently we have 15 people who are interested in going (ranging in age from 16 to 67), with the possibility of a few more going. One question that did come up was the cost for someone outside of our congregation who may want to go along. We would ask that those individual(s) cover the cost of the per person fee from Back Bay Mission, which is \$250.

We will continue to collect personal travel size items (feminine hygiene pads, deodorant, shampoo, soap, Kleenex, toothbrushes, toothpaste, combs, hand lotion, bushes, wet wipes) and we are also asking for donations of sweatshirts and t-shirts. On our first trip we learned how much of a need there was for these items for the homeless, many of whom sleep on the beaches in and near Biloxi.

Our challenge is still in place for the congregation: for those who can to donate \$5 per person each week toward the mission trip to help cover our expenses.

More updates on our progress will follow – if you have any questions please don't hesitate to ask any of the people who have signed up to go on the trip (the list is outside the choir room).

Our next meeting will be at Hoss's on April 8th following our worship service.

Serving Others, Serving Jesus

Luisa knows the land. She has lived near El Panama, Nicaragua for most of her 34 years. She is teaching her two sons to know the land. Luisa also sees the land changing. Rising temperatures and shifting rainfall patterns make the hard work of farming even harder.

In 2015, Luisa joined a 5-year agricultural project through the Council of Protestant Churches of Nicaragua (CEPAD. With farmers like Luisa, CEPAD is working for holistic change.

On her 1.5 acres, Luisa has improved soil quality with manure and mulch. Drip-irrigation techniques provide consistent water. Luisa has already increased her harvest, but she is more excited about the project's future potential.



Her first focus is seeds. Training in seed selection enabled her to plant quality seeds, which she preserved and catalogued for next season and is sharing with her neighbors.

Luisa's hopes stretch farther than next season, though. She hopes the added income will fund her sons' educations to become professionals. At the same time, she is teaching them the land is part of their future—they are responsible for protecting the spring on their property.

With support from CEPAD and One great Hour of Sharing, Luisa is planting seeds that will bear abundant fruit for today, tomorrow, and years to come. With God's help, these seeds will bear far more than we imagine.
