From the Desk of the Church Historian

With the start of Advent (and the new church year) on November 28th we enter into a time that has always been special for St. Jacob's. Christmas celebrations have been important for our congregation for many years.

The oldest photo we have of the sanctuary (from the early 1900s) was of the Christmas decorations in place that year (with their Christmas tree in almost the same location as our current one):





Christmas was always a fun time: with the kids receiving oranges and Hershey bars; the craft day to make items to decorate the church, and to take home, and decorating the church; the children's program (with caroling afterwards); the church Christmas dinner; and of course the Christmas Eve candle light service.

A Brief History of the Christmas Tree Tradition

Modern Christmas tree tradition can be traced back to 16th century Germany with the first documented Christmas tree found on the sculpture of a private home in Alsace (then part of Germany, today France), dating 1576. In the United States, the first Christmas trees appeared in Strasbourg (Pennsylvania) in the 17th century with the arrival of German immigrants. The custom spread across the country in the second half of he 19th century.

Christmas Gift for St. Jacob's

By the time you read this article our church's mortgage is likely to have been "Paid-In-Full"!!

What a blessing to be able to share this news with all of our members, friends and our community at large.

Using resources from members, friends and our Early Learning Center our in-full mortgage repayment permits our previous monthly cash obligation to be used for more worthy purposes and causes. When our Congregation in August approved using designated resources to substantially paydown our mortgage balance it was anticipated that a year-end principal would likely remain. However, since that approval, principal only designated offerings along with the use of an additional modest amount of church resources provided the final dollars needed to bring the mortgage balance to ZERO!

After our final payment, \$75,007.92 remains in our church's savings account. However, of this amount \$73,813.45 is allocated for repairs and improvements that remain to be undertaken. This leaves \$1,194.47 on hand for unanticipated repairs and building improvement expenses as we head into 2022.

Over the past number of years, designated "gifts to St. Jacob's", especially at Christmas time were used for mort-gage principal repayment. This year's appeal will be used to rebuild the undesignated balance in our church's savings account. All "gifts to St. Jacob's" received will be used for future large significant building repairs and improvements. Any of these undertakings will need to be approved beforehand by our Congregation.

If you are able, please consider making an additional offering as a Christmas gift to St. Jacob's to help rebuild our savings account balance.


