It has been quite some time since we have had someone fill the position of "Building and Grounds". We, the consistory, are very pleased to announce Anthony Johnson has accepted the appointment as the "Building and Grounds" chairperson. He will be installed into this position on April 8, 2020 during service.

Carl Reininger's name will be entered into nomination for the position of deacon within our Consistory. This nomination will be voted upon on March 8th at a Congregational meeting.



From Our Accountant's desk...

St. Jacob's UCC - Treasurer's information and notes January, 2020

General account:

- There were four weeks of offerings and receipts during this period, however there were also three bi-weekly payrolls distributed (January 3rd, 17th and 31st). This additional payroll, seasonal utility payments and our quarterly payment for property and liability insurance (check #9190 for \$2,645.50) accounted for nearly all of January, 2020's disbursements.
- Snow and ice treatment costs totaled a modest \$600 during the month. This compares to \$500 paid last January. During February, 2019 our cost was \$1,700, we'll see how the next few weeks develop weather-wise this year.

Building account:

- A number of disbursements during the month, nearly all relating to mortgage payments that have taken our 12/31/2019 balance down almost \$7,000 to \$523,390.25.
- We received Taylor Miller's updated organ keyboard replacement proposal. The cost to complete the work is unchanged at \$4,325.00. The proposal was executed and a deposit check (#1157 for \$2,126.50) was returned to Taylor so that the keyboards could be ordered. The expected turn-around is 8 weeks for Taylor to receive the replacements.
- Amounts not yet paid for upcoming budgeted project costs are shown near the center of the page.
- During the month we were in receipt of a member contribution received directly from the member's tax deferred account. Anyone age 70 or older who has a deferred tax account will benefit from a lower Federal income tax bill for any contributions St. Jacob's receives in this manner. As shown as part of the "savings account" detail the check was deposited into this account and then a portion of the total disbursed to various accounts as directed.
- A deposit was also made into our savings account from our Early Learning Center.

Benevolence account:

- York Association dues were paid near the end of the month using check number 1194 for \$434.00
- Offerings not yet disbursed and budgeted contribution amounts for 2020 are shown as part of the second half of the page.
 Mission of the month offering for January, 2020 have been combined with 2020 Souper Bowl offerings as was done last year.

Offerings and Receipts:

 Early unpredictable calendar weather likely affected our total of offerings for January, 2020. Our combined general and building account totals are \$2,311 less than the average we would hope to collect during this 4-week period.

Other Information:

- On the opposite side of this cover sheet is a one-page listing of 2019 Mission of the Month collections. Please consider recommendations for any changes for 2020.
- The final page of this packet is a one-page sheet that shows the annual report for the St. Jacob's Food Pantry on one side and the annual report for the St. Jacob's Union Cemetery on the other. This information was compiled by folks at the Lutheran Church and forwarded for distribution.
- Since our December 22, 2019 Consistory meeting many tasks have been accomplished, the list includes:
 - Workers' Compensation audit information for the period 12/20/18 to 12/20/19 was prepared, presented and finalized with The Hartford insurance company,
 - Payroll tax returns were prepared and filed for the 4th quarter of 2019,
 - 37 W-2's forms were prepared, printed, circulated and with full-year information filed with tax authorities,
 - Reservation form completed, cover letter and payment sent to Penn Grove Retreat. Payment has cleared,
 - Several full days spent helping with the sanctuary level cleaning, wall repair and painting project.

As you know there are a number of significant upcoming improvement projects that have received budget approval. There are also additional items of work that should be undertaken on and about our property as well as planning for upcoming workdays. The time has come again when I believe it is in our Church's best interest to have Consistory re-establish a trustee/property or a maintenance/building & grounds (call it whatever you like) committee, that would meet regularly to investigate, evaluate, plan and implement these improvement projects and coordinate items needing repair and regular maintenance. Please consider re-formulating a committee of this nature.

March 2020

From the Food and Clothing Bank -

As mentioned in the end-of-year reports, renovations on the brick building continue to progress. Most of the interior work is complete, and the walk-in freezer unit has been delivered and installed. The walk-in refrigerator unit is still in the works – delivery date not yet known.

The reason behind these renovations and upgrades is to better serve the needs of our community. With these structures in place, St. Jacob's Food Pantry and Clothing Bank are going to increase our distribution to TWICE every month, starting in April 2020. Distributions will be on the 1st and 3rd Saturdays of the month.

Hunger is very much present in our community – 1 in 10 adults, and (at least) 1 in 6 children, are "foodinsecure" (statistics from Central PA Food Bank web-site). We have been consistently serving around 80-110 families each month. Each box of food contains staple items (pasta, peanut butter, canned goods, cereal, etc.), some frozen meat, and whatever fresh produce is available. By itself, this is probably less than a weeks worth of food for most of our clients. By distributing twice a month, we can make an even bigger impact in our clients' lives – we can provide nourishing meals to seniors, veterans, adults, families, and children that would otherwise go without.

As we begin this endeavor – WE NEED YOUR HELP! We are going to need to see some new faces volunteering on the distribution days, as well as packing days (Thursdays before distribution) and clothing bank work sessions (dates will be announced).

Please prayerfully consider helping out. The challenge is still in place – we would love if every person in the congregation would help just 1 time this year – whether a distribution, packing, or working with the clothing bank.

We are looking for people to donate desserts for the P.A. Dutch Dinner and there is a sign up sheet on the bulletin board.






Easter Egg Hunt Donations—Due Sunday March 29th

NO CASH NEEDED FUNDRAISER.....



What could be better than a fundraiser that requires no money; and pretty much no work!? All you need to do is save your cancelled US postage stamps that come on letters, cards, bills, etc. Cross Keys Village Stamp Group processes, organizes and sells then in lots to philatelic resellers. The group (40 volunteers) meets weekly (since 1981) to carefully remove the stamps from the envelopes. They process over one (1) million stamps per year. Proceeds from this activity nets more than \$4,000 in profit each year. These funds are given to the Good Samaritan fund to defray

costs of healthcare for residents, or used to purchase items that benefit the entire community. Envelopes with cancelled stamps may be saved as is, or the stamp can be cut from the envelope, allowing a half inch border. If the border is cut too close, the value of the stamp is diminished. A box to collect the stamps/envelopes has been placed in the lobby area. Any questions may be directed to Velinda.




Search Committee update


