





COVID-19 Information

Dear St Jacobs friends,

As the COVID-19 pandemic continues it's a good time to review some of the precautions we are taking at St Jacobs UCC to keep everyone safe. The COVID-19 team has made some modifications to the worship service that you may have noticed.

Singing is risky.

You may notice that we tend to sing less. I may use one hymn and do separate verses at different times throughout worship or shorter sung responses. This is because singing pushes droplets out into the space, risking exposure. Masks help, but the less risk we can take the better. I would invite you to consider humming along while pondering the words rather than singing out boldly.

Keep the air moving! Keep the space open!

We have recommended investing in some fans to keep air moving around, along with keeping doors open all the way to the outside. I know it will be chilly! But fresh air is important.

We will limit the capacity of our sanctuary to 45 people. There will be an overflow area in the hallway outside of the sanctuary and in the fellowship hall if needed. If you are asked to sit outside of the sanctuary we thank you in advance for your cooperation.

Continue to practice mask wearing, social distancing, and being outside as much as possible.

Remember, that these steps not only help to keep members of our community alive and well, they also keep our community itself alive and able to continue worshipping.
