#### UCC Announcement on Styrofoam

On June 9, 2018, a vote was taken and overwhelmingly passed at the annual Penn Central Conference on the Plastic Foam Resolution that was presented by Trinity UCC, Waynesboro. The resolution encourages all congregations to avoid the use of plastic foam (i.e. Styrofoam) in church facilities. Just a few points from this resolution are, plastic foam takes 500 years to decompose. Components that make up plastic foam are known carcinogens in animals and suspected carcinogens in humans. A few weeks ago on Aug 19<sup>th</sup>, a discussion was held in Sunday School on how we can do our part in caring for our environment in regards to the use of plastic foam. To start, we will take a small step during our coffee time by replacing the foam coffee cups with a dozen or so ceramic coffee mugs. Or members are welcome to bring in their own travel mug to use for tea or coffee. Also, we will replacing the foam dessert plates with paper plates. Resources for non-plastic foam food packaging products will be shared with those in our church who work our larger events. Our thought is to start small and hopefully move to replacing plastic foam items at our larger events. The numbers through the end of June showed a combined shortfall in the General and Building Funds of \$6,198 between budgeted expenses and actual offerings.

### **Back Bay Mission Trip 2018 Update for September**

As I write this up we are now less than 3 weeks from our trip to Back Bay Mission and we are currently locked in for 15 people (ranging in age from 16 to 67).

Our last official fundraiser was our August sandwich sale.

**Please remember** that we will continue to collect personal travel size items (feminine hygiene pads, deodorant, shampoo, soap, Kleenex, toothbrushes, toothpaste, combs, hand lotion, bushes, wet wipes) and we are also asking for donations of light sweatshirts and t-shirts. On our first trip we learned how much of a need there was for these items for the homeless, many of whom sleep on the beaches in and near Biloxi.

Our challenge to the congregation is still in place: for those who can to donate \$5 per person each week toward the mission trip to help cover our expenses.

More updates on our progress will follow throughout the September – including updates during our trip to and from Biloxi. And updates of our activities while we are in Biloxi.
